Accreditation Council Profile:

As of April 2009, 568 member institutions hold AACSB business accreditation, of which 171 have additional specialized accreditation for their accounting programs.

In total 33 countries represent the Accreditation Council, and 103 members are from outside the United States.

- 43 institutions with **undergraduate only** programs (7 percent of accredited members)
- 44 institutions with **graduate only** programs (8 percent of accredited members)
- 481 institutions with both graduate and undergraduate programs (85 percent of accredited members)
- 568 Accreditation Council Members
