Academic Year 2006-2007 (Individual Service)

Since the inception of the Civic and Service Education Program (C.A.S.E.) in the fall of 2006, it has been flourishing throughout the North Carolina A&T State University community as well as the Triad community. As a component of the University Studies curriculum and a requirement for graduation, many students have become involved in several service learning projects and community service activities. At the start of C.A.S.E. in the fall of 2006, we registered more than four hundred students with the program. By the end of the spring 2007 semester, the program had registered eight hundred sixty seven students with C.A.S.E. During the 2006-2007 academic year, AGGIES served more than twenty seven reported agencies and organizations. Among the eight hundred sixty seven students who registered during the 2006-2007 academic year, there were four thousand four hundred eight service hours submitted and verified.

Economic Impact based on Individual Service

Charitable organizations most frequently use the value of volunteer time for recognition, events, or communications to show the monetary values extended to the community through support received from an organization or individual volunteers. It is difficult to put a dollar value on volunteer time however; volunteers provide many intangibles that are not easily quantified. The estimated dollar value of volunteer time is \$18.77 per hour for 2006 as reported by Independent Sector Research.

Therefore for the fall 2006 and the inception of the Civic and Service Education Program (C.A.S.E.) the AGGIE student leaders contributed the following in service hours to the Guilford County Triad community.

Academic Year 2006-2007 (Organization Service)

During the 2006-2007 academic year, North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University had one hundred twenty six student organizations registered with the Office for Student Development. As a member of an organization each member is required to do a minimum of ten community service hours per semester. The average number of members per organization is approximately twenty. Our student organizations service our campus community as well as our Greensboro Triad community. At the end of the spring 2007 semester, the organizations and clubs had completed more than fifty thousand four hundred community service hours.

Economic Impact based on Organization Service

Charitable organizations most frequently use the value of volunteer time for recognition, events, or communications to show the monetary values extended to the community through support

received from an organization or individual volunteers. It is difficult to put a dollar value on volunteer time however; volunteers provide many intangibles that are not easily quantified. The estimated dollar value of volunteer time is \$18.77 per hour for 2006 as reported by Independent Sector Research.
