**Collaborative Master of Science Program in Agricultural Education**  
**(Partners: NC A&T State University and NC State University)**  
**Admission's Process**

Students applying for admission to the collaborative master of science program in Agricultural Education between NC A&T State University and NC State University must meet the regular admission requirements of the university they choose as their "home" (degree granting) university. The admission's process for the collaborative program requires applicants to submit the following documents for review: graduate admission application, writing sample, three letters of recommendation, transcripts of all university work attempted and/or completed, and graduate exam scores (if submitted).

Students upon admission to the program are assigned an advisor who guides them in the selection of their graduate committee (two from the home university and one from the collaborating institution (NCSU)). Upon formation of the committee students in consultation with their graduate committee develop a plan of study which must include a minimum of six hours from the collaborating university (NC State University). The program is a thirty-six hour, non-thesis option offered totally online. Students in the collaborative program are advised the same as students in the traditionally delivered program. To date five students have completed the collaborative graduate program.
